GREENWICH HOUSE MUSIC SCHOOL COVID-19 RENTAL GUIDELINES

[as of December 3rd, 2021]

Please read the complete guidelines and sign at the bottom.

- The recital hall and garden capacity is 84 audience members.
- All renters must provide a list of attendees prior to their event, and we are discouraging any
 last-minute arrivals or substitutions. Anyone over the age of 12 MUST provide proof of
 vaccination. Children between ages 5-12 who are not yet fully vaccinated must provide a
 negative PCR test with 72 hours, and children under 5 have no restrictions. These can be
 provided digitally, in person, or with the Excelsior app, at the renter's discretion.
- Please maintain social distancing as you enter and exit the building.
- All common areas in the Music School building will have new capacity restrictions, which will be
 posted outside of each area.
- All visitors must provide contact information and answer a daily health questionnaire as they
 enter the building.
- Because Greenwich House Music School is an all ages facility, all staff, faculty, and essential
 visitors to GHMS *must* wear facial coverings/masks at the Music School at all times, regardless
 of vaccination status.
- If you are sick, stay home. If a visitor becomes or appears sick at the school, they will be asked to leave.
- The Music School building will be cleaned at least once per day, in accordance with CDC guidelines. Staff will clean common areas, such as lobbies, restroom sinks, door handles, etc., at least twice per day. Each studio will have cleaning logs with dates and times of cleaning and disinfection.
- The women's restroom is now located in the basement. Men should use the first floor restroom in the teacher's lounge. Anyone may use the single stall restrooms located on the 2nd and 3rd floors.
- Food and drink are permitted indoors, but masks must be worn while not actively eating or drinking.
- In the event of a positive COVID case in our community, the Music School will close for 24 hours for a deep cleaning. All community members will be immediately informed as a general alert, and anyone we know who came into "close contact" with that individual will be specifically informed.
- According to the latest CDC guidance, close contact is considered contact with a COVID positive
 individual within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more; and anyone who has come into close contact
 with the individuals who tested positive are instructed to quarantine for 14 days, contact their
 health care provider, monitor symptoms, and get a COVID-19 test. All other community
 members should monitor for COVID-19 symptoms.
